**A message from our Principal, Mr Landers:** We are now four weeks into our 'new normal' way of life at Pegasus Academy and I couldn't be more proud of how the vast majority of our learners have returned to school and adapted to life in year group bubbles, wearing masks and our staggered school days. We continue to take advice from the Local Authority, the Trust and Public Health England to ensure we are fully prepared if groups of learners in our academy have to self-isolate. So far it is pleasing to note that we have had no positive test results.

Learners have been shown the new Student Portal and know how to access lesson resources if they unfortunately have to self-isolate. This will ensure that they are able to complete similar work to learners still in school and so do not fall behind. We will be doing more work on this over the coming weeks.

This really is going a long way in closing the gaps from the lockdown period.

### Free School Meals Are You Entitled?



Have your circumstances changed due to COVID-19? Are you now in receipt of benefits such as Universal Credit? If you are, you may be entitled to apply for the Free School Meals entitlement for your child. Even

if your circumstances have only changed for the short term, you still have the right to apply.

The Free School Meals entitlement can be applied for where the parent's income satisfies the following conditions at the time of applying:

Universal Credit (provided monthly net earned income of less than £616.66, after tax and not including any benefits)

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit Run-On paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

If you believe your child should be eligible for Free School Meals based on this criteria, you can apply now. A paper copy of the application form can be collected from the School office, or applications can be made online via

Please note, however, this procedure will only currently work via a PC or laptop, not via a phone or tablet device.

If your circumstances subsequently change meaning you are no longer entitled to Free School Meals, your child's school will continue to receive funding to support your child for 6 years.

All matters regarding Free School Meals are treated confidentially, this is supported by our cashless catering system.

### Coronavirus or Cold/Flu? Know the Symptoms

Colds, flu and Covid-19 are caused by different viruses, but can have similar symptoms. It can be hard to judge which one you may have.



Most people who feel ill with **coronavirus** will have at least one of the key symptoms:

- a high temperature (37.8 degrees or above)
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to their sense of smell or taste

Please do not send children to school if they or any member of your household is displaying the above symptoms. Stay at home and book a test for the symptomatic person. Guidance on isolating should be followed until a test is taken and a result is received. If your child is symptomatic or has had symptoms and is unable to get a test they must complete the ten-day isolation period and must not return to school. Everyone else in the household should isolate for 14 days. As soon as you have your test result you <u>must</u> communicate this with school, even if your child does not have coronavirus and is still ill. **Flu** usually comes on suddenly and sufferers will often experience muscle aches, chills, headaches, tiredness, a sore throat and a runny or stuffed nose, along with the cough. It feels worse than a heavy cold.

**Colds** tend to develop more gradually and are less severe, although they do still make you feel unwell. Along with a cough, there may be sneezing and a sore throat and runny nose. Fever, chills, muscle aches and headaches are rare. You are able to come to school with a cold!

Remember <u>Hands. Face. Space</u> to help stop the spread of coronavirus and other illnesses:

- Wash your hands regularly
- Use a face covering when social distancing is not possible
- Try to keep your distance from those not in your household

All learners must wear a face mask when in corridors/communal areas of the Academy. They should only be removed when in classrooms or when eating/drinking. Disposable face masks are available for learners to purchase for 20p each if they have forgotten/lost/broken theirs. If you are exempt from wearing a mask, you must inform a member of staff who will provide you with an exemption lanyard. Face masks should be regularly replaced (if disposable) or washed to stop the spread of germs please.

Hand sanitizers are placed at many locations around the building, including all classrooms. Please ensure that you use them.

# **Attendance Matters**

#### Why is good attendance and punctuality important?

Education lays the vital foundations of a child's life. Regular and punctual attendance at school is key to both academic and social development, which in turn will improve the life chances of children and young people.

#### What does 90% attendance mean?

- 90% attendance = 1/2 school day missed every week!
- One school year at 90% attendance = 4 weeks of learning missed!
- School years of school =  $\frac{1}{2}$  school year missed!
- ☑ All children and young people nationally whose school attendance is 90% or below are considered to be persistent absentees.
- ☑ Our Attendance Officer is likely to be in regular contact with you until your child's attendance improves.

We encourage you to attend school every day!

# **Uniform Reminder**

Students in Years 8 to 10 are currently being asked to arrive in their kit on days when PE is timetabled. Can we remind you that you need to wear a blazer over the top and no hoodies please.

Year 7 and 11 learners should bring their kit in their bag and change in the Academy.

We also remind learners that jewellery is limited to the following:

- one small ring of religious significance only and a note from a parent/carer is needed in your planner
- one small, plain, metal stud in each ear, preferably the lobe
- a watch

No facial piercings and no stretcher style piercings are allowed.

No jewellery is to be worn at all for PE lessons.

If you are required to wear jewellery for medical reasons, suitable medical evidence must be provided to the Academy.
